12:00 PM HUES AND BLUES

> Director: Vinavakram C. 2024/ India / English / 46 min.

Prasanna, Prasenjit, Ayushi and Vivek are individuals living separate lives and having distinct careers in different cities of the world. Being queer is a common thread they have and united by chance, they come together to throw a camping festival for the queer community in India. The festival is named "URU" meaning "VILLAGE" in the southern languages of India. The documentary captures these individual's journey as they design and build the space for India's first queer camping festival. Their aim is to build a safe space where there is no judgement and all voices can be heard.

> Director: Frauke Finsterwalder 2023 / Germany / German / 132 min.

Irma Countess von Sztáray faces challenges as she becomes Empress Elisabeth's lady-in-waiting. She gets a bloody nose from her strict mother, endures grueling exercises, and a cocaine extract diet before meeting the erratic empress. Despite harsh treatments and diets, they grow close within Sisi's limits. Returning to Vienna, their drastically. Frauke Finsterwalder's lives change reinterpretation of the "Sisi" myth stars Susanne Wolff and Sandra Hüller, with stunning costumes by Tanja Hausner and a soundtrack by Nico, Portishead, and Le Tigre. The film explores a female-dominated world with queer maids and the gay Archduke Viktor.

Jonja falls in love with a girl, and her friendship with Paul becomes even more intense. She relishes the time away from her family routine, until the lie is eventually exposed, and Paul questions their friendship. Anika Mätzke precisely captures the inner world of adolescents, subtly addressing issues related to class and sexual orientation.

Two male musicians fall in love, but blackmail and scandal makes the affair take a tragic turn.

Director: Nguyen Anh Thach 2024/ Vietnam / Vietnamese / 16 min.

This film depicts the tender affection between a gay man and his crush, on the eve of the latter's wedding to his girlfriend.

Jaya and Fatima, two women deeply in love with one another, want to have a family. They have dreamt of a future together that would seem straight out of a fairytale. But then destiny has planned for them otherwise.

Director: Iram Parveen Bilal 2023 / Pakistan / Urdu / 99 min.

In Wakhri, Noor, a widowed single mother and school teacher is faced with diminishing prospects for girls attending her primary school. Noor dreams of fully funding her idea for a women's school amidst clashing social views. By night, she lives a second life amidst Lahore's queer nightclub scene. There she discovers a hidden talent as an activist for women's causes. She is aided by her charismatic best friend Guchhi who pushes her to continue fighting in spite of the odds. However, Noor's escapades unleash unintended consequences, and true to the social media savvy world we inhabit, things begin to spiral out of control.













































VELIPĀDU-THE REVELATION 5:50 PM

Director: Jijo Jessy Kuriakose 2024 / India / Malayalam / 26 min.

Against the sensory landscape of central Kerala, Johnny, a soon-to-be priest must navigate his way out of his dissonant life towards self-discovery. The film reanimates Malayali gay desire through an expressionistic use of Christian music, intimate tastes and unabashed touches, while depicting delicate specifics of same-sex fondness. Resisting the popular narratives, the film discusses relationships possibilities of romantic while depicting intersections of faith versus sexuality, besides the regional specifics of gay intimacy. Interspersing semi-autobiography with fiction, 'Velipādu-The Revelation' is a bitter-sweet rhapsody that sings of love and faith- both lost and regained like some Miltonic Paradise.

Director: Vuslat Karan & Burcu Melekoglu 2022 / Turkey / Turkish / 85 min.

A transgender man's arduous journey of gender affirmation in a traditional Turkish society is chronicled through intimate home videos, capturing the frustrations, humiliations, and endless waiting he endured under intense media scrutiny.







Pratyay Gender Collective: The Pratyay Gender Collective is a sexuality rights initiative that was started in 1997-98 by members of Calcutta's kothi, hijra and other gender non-conforming/ transgender women who remain excluded from the mainstay of broad human rights movements.

Goethe-Institut/Max Mueller Bhavan: The Goethe-Institut is the Federal Republic of Germany's cultural institution operational worldwide. The Goethe-Institut in Kolkata (founded in 1957), like all the other institutes in India, is also known as Max Mueller Bhavan – in honour of Max Müller (1823–1900), a scholar of comparative religion and co-founder of modern Indian studies.

The institute organizes and promotes a wide spectrum of cultural events in Kolkata and other north eastern Indian cities. The focus of the cultural program is to bring together Indian and German artists and intellectuals, present contemporary German culture and foster Indo-German and European cooperation. It also promotes discussions on social and development policy, as well as social issues that are relevant in India and Europe. The artistic and reflexive programs and projects are developed in close cooperation with Indian partner institutions. Since January 2004, the Goethe-Institut Kolkata has housed the South Asia film archive, which loans German films to interested institutions in India and in the neighbouring countries.
